Chestnuts Primary School - Performance 2016-2017

The end of **Key Stage 2** Statutory Attainment Tests (SATs) taken by the Year 6 pupils in May 2017 provide the following information on progress and attainment for our school.

The percentage of pupils who achieved the expected standard of attainment at the end of Key Stage 2.

Reading 66% (National Average 71%)

Writing 68% (National Average 76%)

Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling 66% (National Average 77%)

Mathematics 66% (National Average 75%)

Reading/Writing/Mathematics combined 47% (National Average 61%)

The average progress of pupils at the end of Key Stage 2

Reading 0.4 (confidence interval -1.7 to 2.5)

Writing -0.2 (confidence interval -2.3 to 1.9)

Mathematics 0.4 (confidence interval -1.5 to 2.3).

- · A progress score of 0 means pupils, on average, do about as well at KS2 as those with similar prior attainment nationally.
- · A positive progress score means pupils, on average, do better at KS2 than those with similar prior attainment nationally.
- · A negative progress score means pupils, on average, do worse at KS2 than those with similar prior attainment nationally.

Reading 102 (National Average 104)

Mathematics 102 (National Average 104)

Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling 102 (National Average 106)

The end of **Key Stage 1** Statutory Attainment Tests (SATs) taken by the Year 2 pupils in May 2017 provide the following information on progress and attainment for our school.

The percentage of pupils who achieved the expected standard of attainment at the end of Key Stage 1.

Reading 77% (National Average 76%)

Writing 53% (National Average 68%)

Mathematics 68% (National Average 75%)

Phonics testing 64% (National Average 81%)

The end of **EYFS** teacher assessments measure if the children have achieved a 'good level of development' by the end of reception in May 2017.

The percentage of pupils who achieved a good level of development

Achieved Good Level of Development - 68% (National average 69%)
